1. Minutes of last meeting were agreed

2. Matters Arising

a. Late Night Shopping and Xmas lights SM commented: Hard work for small team. Had to improvise stage. Got too crowded. Traffic holdups. Crowd dispersed when celebrity made their exit. 246 rerouted to avoid the centre. Expenses 383, income 525, profit 142. Spent 600 on outdoor cables and matting. HM commented the Xmas lights were better received although still ongoing issues and new contractors would be considered this year. Council budget has been increased.

b. Linden Homes development

SM: On 11th Nov 2015, Steve Houkes reported 45 housing units now reduced to 38. There will be parking spaces for 83 cars, ie ratio of 1.9 per house. **AW** said WTC has commented on pedestrian safety, public parking spaces, and narrow access to allotment area

c. M25 Junction slips

If this project ever happens it will help people get on/off the M26, rather than needing to go up to J3 at Swanley. Our SDC councillor Diana Esler is on the committee and has recently commented that there is now a shortlist of 3, Westerham being one

d. Market

Winter winds are most unkind. Fresh pasta will be here on 1st Sunday each month. Fish here 3rd Sunday. Need more stalls. **JH** commented Sevenoaks are starting a new outdoor market at the Vine.

e. Town Sign update

SM reported that WTC has mixed views and didn't like the position of Verrells Corner, or saw the need for more than 1. Undecided about location, **HM** requested sight of latest designs

f. Village Design Statement

HM and WTC are leading a team of volunteers, including input from a town planner. Draft to be published at Town Meeting in April. The sentiments in this document will be adopted by planners and influence design of houses in Westerham

3. Proud to do Business and Finance statement

NT report was presented, the two sources of income being the market and the Proud to Do Business initiative.: bank balance is £7419. Expected expenses this year: Talking Statues project, sculptures, Xmas lights, gym pieces

- 4. Moorhouse development planning application refused at the first round
- 5. **Open Air Gym** equipment at King George's Field obtained SDC grant (£1000) + Richard Parry+ £1000 from WTP- awaiting council proposal cost expected to be £8-9000

6. Future Events

7. Talking Statues, actors scripts, trails.

BC is masterminding script committee. 22 locations identified, 8 of which are written. **JH** asked that 3 be in place for marketing purposes by spring and undertook to ask Council for permissions to be sought (separate ones for The Green may not be required)

8. **Business Development District (BID)** Oxted has already made successful bid for money, which comes from a levy on business rates. **JH** and **HM** to meet Oxted BID coordinator with **AH** and take forward with SDC

9. Proposal for a Westerham Bypass

- a. **AW** confirmed a town meeting has been called for the 25th February.
- b. HW put the case for a by-pass funded by new homes, to include relocation of the school and improvement of infrastructure to support, and reiterated he only wanted to proceed with town support. It would involve lorries filling the Covers Farm quarry for 4-5 years prior to building foundations for by-pass. Estimated number of homes 600-800 (as a guide Madan Rd is about 300 homes)
- c. **JH** commented that a holistic approach should be implemented: advantages and fears raised must be studied and mitigation plans effected.
- d. **SM** speculated that a risk analysis would be a valuable approach

10. AOB

- a) Walking Trail to Chartwell: ZC confirmed it was all agreed, permissions still need to be granted and she would chase up, to see if we can implement before the season
- b) Darent Valley: HW is talking to Rick Bayne about signage
